THIS WEEK AT MASS

Monday, November 13: St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, virgin (+1917). She was from Lombardi, the youngest of thirteen children; she founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. For twenty-eight years she labored in U.S. and South America, establishing some sixty-seven institutions (schools, hospitals, and orphanages). She was the first U.S. Citizen canonized (1946). She is the patroness of immigrants and migrants.

Wednesday, November 15: St. Albert the Great, bishop, doctor (+ 1280). He was a Dominican, a master of philosophy and theology, and a teacher of St. Thomas Aquinas.

Friday, November 17: St. Elizabeth of Hungary, religious (+ 1231). She was the wife of Louis VI of Thuringia and mother of three. She died at age 23 and was canonized only four years after her death.
