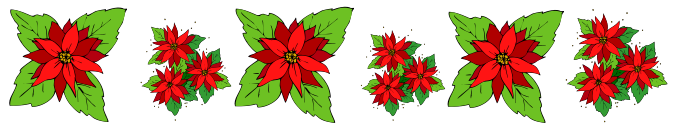
### JANUARY 22 DAY OF PRAYER AND PENANCE

January 22 is the anniversary of the 1973 Supreme Court decision, *Roe vs. Wade which legalized abortion*. "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. (General Instruction on the Roman Missal, #373). Our observance of this sad anniversary, then, will take place this year on Monday, January 22. The 7:30 am Mass that day will use prayers from the Mass "For Giving Thanks to God for the Gift of Human Life."
