Dear Friends

Last week we began our brief journey through the Sacraments of Healing by looking at Confession. This week we turn to the Sacrament of Anointing of the

Sick.

Very often I am called to offer this Sacrament in the last days or even last minutes of someone's life. This Sacrament is far more than just a "last Sacrament". The Letter of St. James tells us that if someone is sick with a serious illness, they should send for a priest. The illness does not have to be deadly or even terminal.

The Sacrament is intended to provide a healing encounter with Jesus Christ. Healing happens in many ways; it is primarily a spiritual healing. When one is sick it is very easy to lose hope, to become discouraged or feel isolated or alone.

The Sacraments reminds us that Christ is always with us because it is him who is giving us the Sacraments. Anointing with blessed oil is an ancient practice, going back to the Old Testament. Jesus gives us this Sacrament to restore our health of mind, spirit and perhaps even of body.

So, who should receive this Sacrament? The easy answer is anyone who is ill. If you've been diagnosed with a chronic or terminal illness, this Sacrament is for you. If you are preparing for surgery, this Sacrament is for you. If you are struggling with serious mental illness, this Sacrament is for you.

My only request with this Sacrament is please do not wait until the last minute to contact me or any other priest for this Sacrament. We will certainly do our best to get to you or your loved one should that occur. It is understandable that emergencies happen and there are things just beyond our control. As soon as the illness is diagnosed, that's when to call. It can be received more than once and it is a blessing for any priest to share the moment of prayer and to be with someone who is sick, to walk with them and to assist them in this journey.

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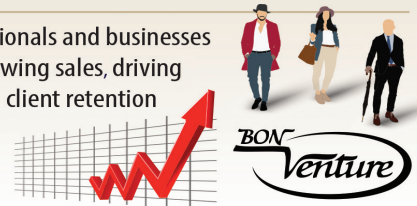
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
