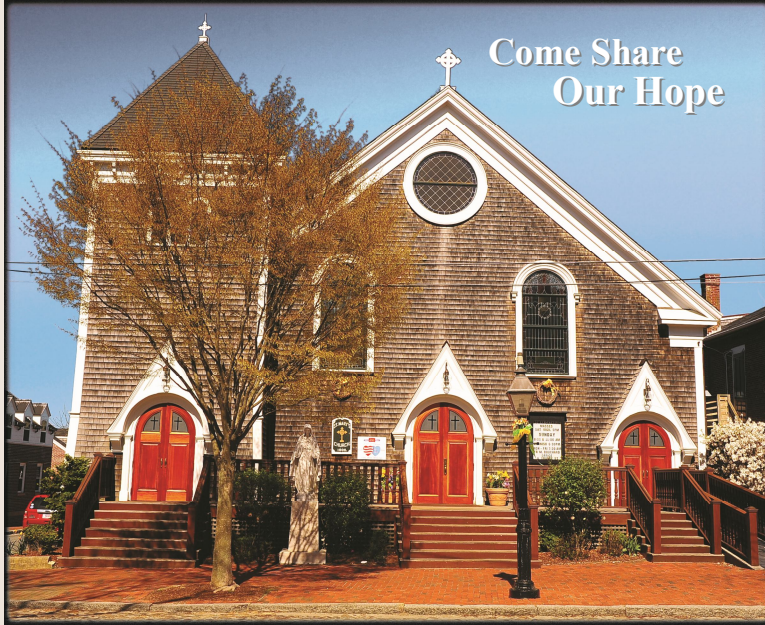

THIS WEEK AT MASS

Wednesday, November 1: All Saints. This feast began as a celebration of the life and death of martyrs in the East. It moved to the West, was celebrated on May 13, and by Pope Gregory IV (827-844) was transferred to November 1, adopting perhaps the English-Gallican practice dating from the first quarter of the eighth century. On this day we remember and honor all those "who have made their robes white by the blood of the Lamb," those named and unnamed witnesses of the faith who enjoy the gift of eternal salvation, are models for us, and intercede for us.

Thursday, November 2: Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. Rooted in ancient Christian tradition (second century and Tertullian). St. Odilo of Cluny established a memorial of all the faithful departed in 988. It was accepted in Rome in the thirteenth century. This is the day for remembering all those who have gone before us, especially those near and dear to us. We pray for their eternal repose and thank God for the lives they shared with us. From this comes the tradition of visiting the graves of loved ones, and praying for them all during the month.

Friday, November 3: St. Martin de Porres, religious (+1639). Born in Lima, Peru of a Spanish father and a black slave mother, he became a Dominican lay brother who humbly ministered to the poor and the sick, especially African slaves. He was devoted to the Holy Eucharist and a close friend of St. Rose of Lima. He is the patron of social justice and of people of mixed races.

November: All Souls

November is traditionally known as the Month of All Souls. It begins with the feast of All Saints on November 1, and the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls) on November 2. All during the month at Mass we will remember our loved ones who have gone before us. "All Souls" envelopes have been placed at the church entrance, and are in your "budget envelope" packet. Just list the names of those you would like to have remembered at Masses during the month of November. Names will be inscribed in a *Book of Remembrance*, which will be placed on the altar during Mass. Be sure to include your own name on the front of the envelope.

Dear Friends,

"God is good!" We say this so often when things have gone our way; "God is good!" But here's the truth; God is always good, even when things do not go our way.

We say that God is good when the weather turns out right for an event we had planned. But would God still be good if the weather was miserable? Of course! We say God is good when we get a good health report or when someone recovers from a serious illness. But God is still good even in the bad health report and when someone dies. We say God is good when there is peace; but God is still good even when there is war and violence.

God doesn't change with the whims of nature or human activity. God is unchanging; he gives us everything we need to navigate through life. Yes God is good; all the time -- in every circumstance.

One of my favorite Christians of the 20th century is Corrie Ten Boom. She was from the Netherlands. Her family hid and protected Jewish People during WWII. This eventually got them caught by the Nazis. Corrie and her sister were prisoners at Ravensbruck concentration camp. Corrie's sister, Betsie, didn't survive. Even in that horror Corrie still believed in the goodness of God. These are her words:

"I remember telling Betsie that I thought God had forgotten us. "No, Corrie," said Betsie, "He has not forgotten us. Remember His Word: 'For as the heavens are high above the earth, so great is His steadfast love toward those who fear Him. There is an ocean of God's love available--there is plenty for everyone. May God grant you never to doubt that victorious love--whatever the circumstances.'"

I encourage you, during these challenging times, to get to know Corrie Ten Boom and to rely on God's steadfast love and goodness.

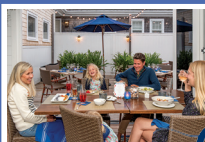
