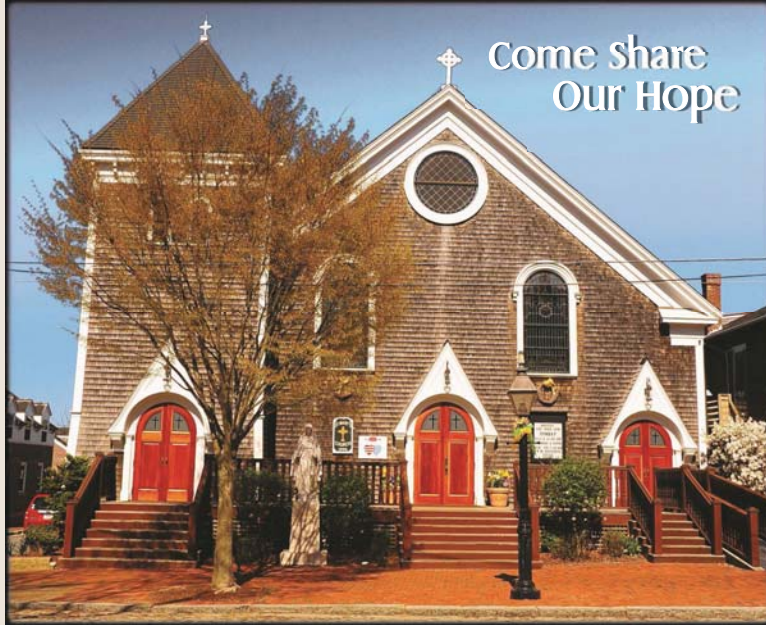

Dear Friends,

This column will be a "twofer" in the sense that it will run both weekends which surround Independence Day. I think it is a good idea to reflect upon the true nature of freedom and liberty.

Each year, on the Fourth of July, I take some time to watch the scene in

John Adams (HBO miniseries) in which the Declaration of Independence is being written; then voted on and then read in various voices. I find the scene to be compelling. I never tire of watching it as it reminds me of what the founders of this nation had in mind.

The Freedom we enjoy in this Country was purchased at a tremendous price. Countless men and women made sacrifices which, to many of us, would seem impossible today. The fact that these sacrifices seem so impossible to us today is what could in fact cost us the freedom that has been bestowed on us. We need to consider carefully, to discern, how to best protect the treasure we have in this Republic.

I offer that the way our founders looked at freedom, and the way we need to look at freedom, is different from how freedom is considered today. Pope St. John Paul II said "Freedom consists in not doing what we like, but in having the right to do what we ought." Rather than thinking of freedom as what it can get me, why not look at freedom as to how we can best serve God and one another? This is true freedom. Every great civilization in history knew this. But the moment a people or a nation began to use freedom to seek its own selfish interests, whether as individuals or as a whole, that is when that civilization began to collapse. No nation or people are exempt from this consequence, not even our great Nation.

So when we celebrate our independence as a Nation let us keep in mind our responsibilities, which are more important than our rights. Our prime responsibility is to acknowledge from whom our freedom comes -- God Himself. Then we must ensure those unalienable rights, guaranteed to every person and enshrined in our Founding Document, "Life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness." Always keeping in mind that without the right to life, the others don't matter.
