Dear Friends,

With the Papal Conclave just a few days away it is fitting to ponder what our attitude and disposition really should be as the Cardinals elect a Successor of St. Peter.

Like me, I am sure you've heard many people discussing the possibilities, the potential candidates; the "papabile" as they have come to be known. Certainly there is anticipation

and excitement; appropriately so.

But while we are all hopeful in this time of transition it is important to consider what the Papal Conclave is not. It is first and foremost not an American Election, thanks be to God! There is no campaigning, there are no posters or ads. There are no flashy television commercials with multimillion dollar price tags. This is an election process which is perhaps the oldest in the world. It is rooted in faith, prayer, tradition and above all it is guided by the Holy Spirit; this is why the Cardinal Electors process into the Sistine Chapel to the chanting of "Veni Creator Spiritus".

I would urge everyone to avoid using terminology which is secular to discuss who the next Pope will be. Terms like "liberal, conservative, progressive, or old fashioned" are not helpful and they reduce the Papacy, and the Church, to just one human entity and institution among so many others. This is not what the Church is. If we believe our Church to be established by the Son of God Himself (which in truth it is) then let us pray that the Cardinals, indeed all the Faithful, engage in fervent prayer over these next several days. The Church is the Body of Christ on Earth; she is the Bride of Christ. The Pope is the Successor of St. Peter and the Vicar of Christ.

Come Holy Spirit, Creator blest, in our hearts and souls take up thy rest. Come with thy grace and heavenly aid, to fill the hearts which thou hast made.
