THIS WEEK AT MASS

Monday, June 29: Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles. Peter died around 64 AD in Rome under the power of Nero. He was a Galilean fisherman, became the spokesman for the Twelve, and is known as the "Prince of the Apostles." Two epistles are ascribed to him. He is the patron of those in the fishing industry. Paul, according to tradition, was martyred in Rome around 67 AD. He was a Pharisee who became the "Apostle of the Gentiles." His letters may be dated from 50 to 65. He is the patron of the lay apostolate, the Cursillo Movement, and Catholic Action; also of Malta and Greece.

Tuesday, June 30: The First Martyrs of the Holy Roman Church – those many Christians who were tortured, crucified, and burned alive around 64 AD in Nero's gardens on the Vatican Hill are honored today. Pope St. Clement I in his letter to the Corinthians testifies to these events.

Wednesday, July 1: Blessed Junipero Serra, priest (+ 1784). From Petra, Majorca, Spain, a Franciscan missionary who arrived in New Spain in 1750 and established nine of the California missions. He baptized over 6,000 native people and is recognized as one of the builders of the state of California. Pope John Paul II called him "an exemplary model of the selfless evangelizer." His canonization by Pope Francis is tentatively scheduled in Washington, DC for September 23, 2015, during the Holy Father's visit to our country.

Friday, July 3: St. Thomas the Apostle. He died in the first century. His doubting gave way to faith when he saw the risen Lord. He is associated with founding the Church in south India and is the patron of builders, India, Pakistan.

Dear Friends,

When you enter the Church this weekend you will notice that the images of the Stations of the Cross have been temporarily replaced for the summer by a series of portraits of saints and holy men and women. Some may wonder why.

The Stations of the Cross invite us to walk with Jesus on His journey to Calvary. They remind us that the Christian life is not always easy and that the path to holiness passes through the Cross.

While the images of the Stations are not physically present during these summer months, they have not disappeared; in fact, the Way of The Cross is very much before our eyes in the lives of the saints now displayed throughout the church.

These men and women come from different centuries, countries, cultures, and walks of life. We see St. Charbel, the humble Lebanese monk; Servant of God Dorothy Day, who served the poor and challenged the comfortable; St. Augustine and his faithful mother, St. Monica; St. Oscar Romero, who gave his life for the Gospel; St. Maximilian Kolbe, who died in place of another prisoner; St. Isidore the Farmer, finding holiness in ordinary work; St. Martin de Porres, known for his humility and charity; St. Joseph, the quiet protector of the Holy Family; St. Thérèse of Lisieux, who showed us the "little way" of love; and St. Gertrude of Nivelles, a woman of prayer and hospitality.

Each of them embraced the Cross of Christ in a unique way. Their lives demonstrate what discipleship looks like when the Gospel is taken seriously. They remind us that holiness is not reserved for a select few. It is the vocation of every Christian.

The beautiful artwork is the work of Nancy Marek Cote, whose talent helps bring these holy men and women before us in a way that invites reflection and prayer. As you move through the church this summer, I encourage you to spend a few moments with these images. Ask the saints to pray for you. Reflect on their lives. Consider the particular way each one carried the Cross entrusted to them. In doing so, we may discover more clearly how Christ is calling each of us to carry our own.

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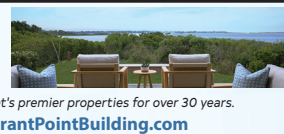
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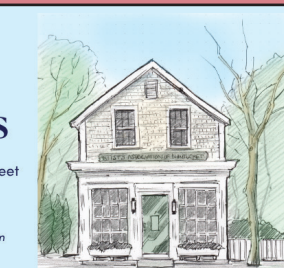
