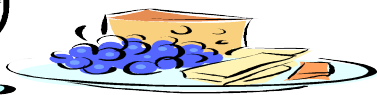

THIS WEEK AT MASS

Tuesday, November 3: St. Martin de Porres, religious (+1639). Born in Lima, Peru of a Spanish father and a black slave mother, he became a Dominican lay brother who humbly ministered to the poor and the sick, especially African slaves. He was devoted to the Holy Eucharist and a close friend of St. Rose of Lima. He is the patron of social justice and of people of mixed races.

Wednesday, November 4: St. Charles Borromeo, bishop (+1584). At age twenty-six he became a cardinal and secretary of state for his uncle, Pope Pius IV. He implemented the reforms of the Council of Trent in his diocese of Milan. He founded seminaries and was considered a model pastor by many bishops, including St. Francis de Sales. He led five provincial councils and eleven diocesan synods. He is the patron of catechists and of catechumens. NOVEMBER: ALL SOULS

November is traditionally known as the Month of All Souls. It begins with the feast of All Saints on November 1, and the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls) on November 2. All during the month at Mass we will remember our loved ones who have gone before us. "All Souls" envelopes have been placed at the church entrance, and are in your "budget envelope" packet for November and December. Just list the names of those you would like to have remembered at Masses during the month of November. Names will be inscribed in a *Book of Remembrance*, which will be placed near the baptismal font in our church. Be sure to include your own name on the front of the envelope. Donations are not necessary, but would be gratefully appreciated.

Sunday, All Saints

November 1: All Saints. This feast began as a celebration of the life and death of martyrs in the East. It moved to the West, was celebrated on May 13, and transferred by Pope Gregory IV (827-844) to November 1, adopting perhaps the English-Gallican practice dating from the first quarter of the eighth century. On this day we remember and honor all those "who have made their robes white by the blood of the Lamb," those named and unnamed witnesses of the faith who enjoy the gift of eternal salvation, are models for us, and intercede for us. This feast replaces our usual Sunday celebration.

Monday, November 2:

Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed

This celebration is rooted in ancient Christian tradition (second century and Tertullian). St. Odilo of Cluny established a memorial of all the faithful departed in 988. It was accepted in Rome in the thirteenth century. This is the day for remembering all those who have gone before us, especially those near and dear to us. We pray for their eternal repose and thank God for the lives they shared with us. From this comes the tradition of visiting the graves of loved ones, and praying for them all during the month. **Readings (chosen from among the many possibilities for Masses for the dead):**
