THIS WEEK AT MASS

Tuesday, February 21: St. Peter Damian, Bishop, Doctor of the Church (+1072). He was a defender of the Gregorian reform while he was a monk; later he became the cardinal bishop of Ostia. He was a great promoter of religious life.

Wednesday, February 22: The Chair of St. Peter, the Apostle. Today's feast has its roots in the commemoration of dead relatives and friends celebrated in Rome between February 13-22. A chair was left empty for particular deceased persons. Since the date of St. Peter's death was unknown, it came to be commemorated on February 22.

Thursday, February 23: St. Polycarp, bishop and martyr (+around 155 at age 86). He was a disciple of St. John and bishop of Smyrna. His *Letter to the Philippians* witnesses to various New Testament writings. He was one of the first martyrs to be venerated. (The *Martyrdom of Polycarp* records his being burned at the stake.)

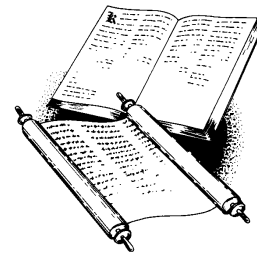
