World Day of the Poor - November 18

Pope Francis has once again asked all Catholics to observe the annual "World Day of the Poor." This will be Sunday November 18 – just before the end of the Liturgical Year (Christ the King Sunday), and – for us in the USA - the Sunday before Thanksgiving. While we should be caring for and praying for the poor every day, such a special day calls this to mind in a more intense manner. Last year, we had a very successful collection of clothing for the homeless. We've checked with the program directors of the human service agencies of the Cape Cod (and Islands) Council of Churches – and here's what's needed this year: For the 1,000 children and early teens in need on Cape Cod:

Pajamas, slippers and bathrobes - children ages 3 - 18; new & unwrapped.

The greatest need is for the 300 youngest children, size 0 - 5T (they like footed types of pajamas).

We'll be accepting these donations at all Masses on **November 17 and 18**. Please plan ahead for those days, since the pre-Christmas distribution dates are not long thereafter.

They will be distributed to:

- A Baby Center (Hyannis)
- Hands of Hope (Harwich), for Cape-wide Christmas program at Holy Trinity Parish
- Youth Street Reach, for Saint Joseph House (Hyannis shelter run by our diocese). Thank You!
